I always stress that the money raised by Councils using this scheme is entirely for them to decide where to send, and our new District Almoner III Comp Paul Fernandez-Montes will oversee the scheme to ensure Councils have a complete record of their funds.

Upon appointing our District Lecturer III Comp John Handley last year I mentioned that he might like to think about creating papers and presentations of interest to Councils short of ceremonies, and a presentation to Mark Lodges or RA Chapters to stimulate interest in our Order. He has been working enthusiastically on these and we now have some splendid presentations available with more to follow.

My hearty thanks go to not only those enthusiastic and imaginative Companions mentioned, but to everyone who forms part of a great team.
